Specifically, it contains the activities endorsed by the Business Services Industry Reference Committee (IRC) through to June 2020. PwC's Skills for Australia is seeking input from a diverse range of stakeholders to guide our ongoing project work.

Technical Skills

The Business Services IRC has determined that there are several professionalised areas within BSB that require a high degree of technical expertise. It was proposed that these areas should be reviewed separately from enterprise skills. The purpose of this project is to 'deep-dive' into each technical profession and determine skills and trends impacting these areas. These training products are directly linked to job occupations.

Enterprise Skills

The Business Services IRC has identified that the BSB Training Package is home to many generic employability skills. The entire Training Package (minus 'Technical Skills') will be evaluated at the unit level upwards. Qualifications will be streamlined, deleted and created as necessary to align with identified 'enterprise' skills needs. The IRC has observed that there is significant duplication and obsolescence that will also be addressed.

What is Business Services?

The Business Services sector covers a broad range of workers who are employed by a vast number of Australian organisations. Workers in the sector provide the skills needed to effectively operate and successfully manage an organisation. There is no unifying organisation type which uses Business Services training, rather workers in the sector provide professional assistance to all organisations. There are 2 million people working in Business Services occupations, down 7 per cent over the past two years, but still representing a high proportion (17 per cent) of Australian jobs. The three industries that employ the most Business Services graduates are: Health Care and Social Assistance, Retail Trade and Public Administration and Safety.
