



RETAIL THEFT - VERBAL & PHYSICAL AGGRESSION RETAILER SURVEY

In response to retailers reporting an increase in both verbal and physical aggression accompanying retail theft, the SafeCity Network conducted a survey of Brisbane retailers to better understand the issue.

85% of retailers experience verbal abuse while trying to prevent theft

FREQUENCY OF ABUSE


52% of retailers are abused in over 50% of all retail theft incidents

78% of retailers believe abuse is increasing.
