First Aid Kit Checklist



First Aid refers to the initial treatment or emergency care provided to one who is ill or injured prior to receiving professional medical assistance. An appropriate number of first aid kits are to be maintained and all workers advised where they can be located. Where there are separate work areas, it may be appropriate to locate first aid facilities centrally and provide portable first aid kits in each work area, including motor vehicles. The QLD First Aid Code of Practice 2004 states that a First Aid Kit should contain at least the following:

	Adhesive strips (assorted sizes) for minor wound dressing		Re-usable ice-pack for the management of strains, sprains and bruises
0	Non-allergenic adhesive tape for securing dressings and strapping		Forceps/tweezers for removing foreign bodies
0	Eye pads for emergency eye cover		Disposable latex or vinyl gloves for infection control
0	Triangular bandage for slings, support and/or padding		Sharps disposal container for infection control and disposal purposes
0	Hospital crepe or conforming bandage to hold dressings in place	0	Sterile saline solution or sterile water for emergency eye wash or for irrigating eye wounds. This saline solution must be discarded after opening
0	Wound/combine dressings to control bleeding and for covering wounds		
	Non-adhesive dressings for wound dressing		Resuscitation mask to be used by qualified personnel for resuscitation purposes
	Safety pins to secure bandages and slings		Antiseptic solution for cleaning wounds and skin
	Scissors for cutting dressings or clothing		Plastic bags for waste disposal
	Kidney dish for holding dressings and instruments	0	Note pad and pen/pencil for recording the injured or ill person's condition and treatment given
	Small dressings' bowl for holding liquids		Re-usable ice-pack for the management of strains, sprains and bruises

NOTE: First aid kits should not contain medication, including painkillers such as paracetamol and aspirin because of their potential to cause adverse health effects in some people including pregnant women and people with medical conditions.
