

TRADING HOURS SUMMARY:

22 September 2022 National Day of Mourning

As at 14 September 2022

Prime Minister Anthony Albanese has declared 22 September 2022 a National Public Holiday to commemorate the passing of Queen Elizabeth II.

Following the Federal announcement, the States and Territories are charged with gazetting and setting state-relevant trade restrictions.

The National Retail Association has consulted with all States and Territories to confirm allowable hours for non-exempt retailers.

Below is your **definitive guide** to understanding your allowable trading hours per State and Territory on 22 September 2022.

QLD	Tourist areas	7am-9pm
	Current 7-day	9am-6pm
	Current 6-day	9am-6pm
SA	CBD	12pm-9pm
	Metro, Glenelg, Proclaimed Shopping Districts	12pm-9pm
TAS	No restrictions – open to trade	
VIC	No restrictions – open to trade	
WA	Perth Metro	11am-5pm
