First Aid Kit Checklist

First Aid refers to the initial treatment or emergency care provided to one who is ill or injured prior to receiving professional medical assistance. An appropriate number of first aid kits are to be maintained and all workers advised where they can be located. Where there are separate work areas, it may be appropriate to locate first aid facilities centrally and provide portable first aid kits in each work area, including motor vehicles. The QLD First Aid Code of Practice 2004 states that a First Aid Kit should contain at least the following:

\bigcirc	Adhesive strips (assorted sizes) for minor wound dressing	\bigcirc	Re-usable ice-pack for the management of strains, sprains and bruises
\bigcirc	Non-allergenic adhesive tape for securing dressings and strapping	\bigcirc	Forceps/tweezers for removing foreign bodies
\bigcirc	Eye pads for emergency eye cover	\bigcirc	Disposable latex or vinyl gloves for infection control
\bigcirc	Triangular bandage for slings, support and/or padding	\bigcirc	Sharps disposal container for infection control and disposal purposes
\bigcirc	Hospital crepe or conforming bandage to hold dressings in place	\bigcirc	Sterile saline solution or sterile water for emergency eye wash or for irrigating eye
\bigcirc	Wound/combine dressings to control bleeding and for covering wounds	\bigcirc	wounds. This saline solution must be discarded after opening
\bigcirc	Non-adhesive dressings for wound dressing	\bigcirc	Resuscitation mask to be used by qualified personnel for resuscitation purposes
\bigcirc	Safety pins to secure bandages and slings	\bigcirc	Antiseptic solution for cleaning wounds and skin
\bigcirc	Scissors for cutting dressings or clothing	\bigcirc	Plastic bags for waste disposal
\bigcirc	Kidney dish for holding dressings and instruments	0	Note pad and pen/pencil for recording the injured or ill person's condition and treatment given
О	Small dressings' bowl for holding liquids	\bigcirc	Re-usable ice-pack for the management of strains, sprains and bruises

NOTE: First aid kits should not contain medication, including painkillers such as paracetamol and aspirin because of their potential to cause adverse health effects in some people including pregnant women and people with medical conditions.
